They made multistory buildings from stones and adobe clay. Adobe clay was made from water, dirt, and straw. Many of their towns were built right into the sides of cliffs. They used ladders to climb from one level to another.

Breechcloths and cloth headbands around their heads

10. In the winter men would wear **cloaks** to keep them warm.

They ground the corn into flour and used it to make thin cakes.

Interesting Facts about the Pueblo

- **The Hopi are a Pueblo people, but are often considered a separate tribe.**
- **Some Native Americans still live in ancient pueblo buildings that were built nearly 1000 years ago.**
- **In Pueblo religion all things had a spirit called a kachina. They carved kachina dolls that represented different spirits.**
- **They did not have a written language.**
- **The Pueblo Indians are known for their artistic pottery. One of their most famous artists was pottery maker Maria Martinez.**
